Welcome back to all our students. We hope everyone including parents have enjoyed their holidays and are well rested ready to embark on a new term. The topic throughout the school this half term is linked to homes.

Walking home permission forms: We will be sending out permission forms for children in KS2 whose parents are happy for their children to walk themselves home or meet in an arranged location at the end of the school day. Where applicable please sign and return to the office as soon as possible. Only children with signed parental permission will be allowed to leave the school premises at the end of each day.

Daily timetable: Your child may have mentioned that we have started a new morning timetable within school. With our focus on maths, all early morning tasks (8:45-9:00) have a maths focus and our maths lessons start promptly at 9:00. After an input and an age related task, we have a short assembly. During the assembly, teachers are able to go through these tasks and regroup children according to how they have demonstrated their understanding of the concept. Children then are able to return to their maths lesson where they are able to move onto a challenge task, consolidate their understanding or work with an adult for some same day intervention enabling them to work towards meeting the age related level. The initial impact has been extremely positive, with teachers reporting greater focus from the children and children saying that they feel like they have more time to think about the maths and can concentrate better – although both have also said that we are getting used to the new routine and feel like it should be lunch at 10:15!

Carol Service: We were delighted so many were able to join us for our Carol Service at the end of last term. We had lots of very positive feedback about the wonderful singing. Over £220 was raised in the collection which is being donated to AMMF in memory of Alexa.



Pupil Premium Funding

Pupil premium is extra funding given to the school to support pupils of all abilities. Our school cam receive valuable funding which can be used to support all the children in their education

- £935 for a secondary age pupil
- £1,320 for a primary age pupil
