Hot Meals After half term, parents of children in EYFS and KS1 will be able to have a hot lunch - please ensure you order via Local Food Links at least a week in advance. Due to the separation of the bubbles, we are not yet able to offer this for KS2, but we are regularly reviewing this situation. Pupil premium children in KS2 will still be able to order packed lunches.	Lunchtimes We have been made aware that parents are concerned that their children are being stopped from eating all of their lunch and are going hungry; this is not the case! This week, we have been able to eat outside so children have had 40 minutes to eat - the majority have finished within 15 minutes. When we eat indoors, children have 20 minutes, which is more than enough time for the majority of children to finish their food. Occasionally, a few have not finished and these children are supported and encouraged on an individual basis. Sometimes children choose not
	to finish their food or say they don't like it; if they
	say they are still hungry, we provide fruit.
