Autumn Term 2021 - First Half

Week Beginning 18th October 2021

Explorers: What a super busy week it's been! In maths we looked at the number 4 and then made our own numberbonds to 4 using counting teddies to help us. In phonics we learned c and k and focussed on blending the sounds together into words. On Monday we made our own playdough using Mrs McDonald's special recipe and each day we used it to make numbers and letters as well as cakes, pancakes and all sorts of other things, cooking them in our special box oven. Have a fantastic half term holiday and remember to keep up with the reading and spotting letters in the environment!

Pathfinders: Its been a busy couple of weeks in Pathfinder's with the children finally writing their own 'We're going on a bear hunt' stories and we were able - despite the weather's best efforts - to complete our Local Area treasure hunt. The children did very well to correctly predict the mystery word 'Charmouth' after only the first few clues. We thoroughly enjoyed following the instructions to explore different areas of Charmouth and were made very welcome by a number of our local businesses and attractions - thank you! Well done to Pathfinders for being such good detectives and behaving so sensibly throughout. Not only did the children write their own stories, but they also marked each others work! We were so impressed by how supportive they were of each other, with brilliant listening and excellent target setting for our next steps. Great job guys! In maths in year two we have been busy looking at place value of numbers, particularly tens and ones, and completing various comparison activities. In year one the children have been making their own number sentences. We are very much looking forward to focusing on the history of our local area and completing some plant experiments for science after half term. We hope you all have a fun holiday!

Navigators: We have had such a wonderful week, the highlight of which was a visit to Dorchester museum and to the Roman townhouse. We were acting as archaeologists digging up Roman graves and finding out what the grave artefacts were and what they could tell us about the person that died. We then matched our items with previous finds in the museum's displays. We were amazed at the detail within the remaining mosaics and decided that carpeting may be easier. Our most interesting fact: Romans did not believe that children under seven could be classed as human! This caused a great deal of consternation.

Many thanks to all those who took part in the consultation on our Plan on a Page. We have now considered all the feedback we received and finalised the plan. It can be viewed here. Please note when reading it, that the bullet points are not listed in any order of importance – everything we have set out here is important to us. We had many questions raised in the course of the consultation, which we will be responding to through regular updates on the newsfeed over the rest of this term.

A point raised was that the plan on the page does not explain how it will be delivered. This document has been kept deliberately short with key headlines only. Within school, there are further layers of development and action planning to ensure that we are working towards the objectives on the Plan on a Page.

Targeted at the parents of children in year 2 (but all parents welcome), this session will outline the arrangements for the KS1 SATs as well as outlining the expectations, evidencing attainment and how children will be prepared.

Covid Updates

We continue to work closely with Public Health Dorset and Dorset Council to ensure that we are doing all that we can to help keep all members of the community safe. Schools have been advised of the sharply increasing rates in the South West, with the majority of cases in school age groups and increased hospital admissions. In light of the information shared this week, we will closely review our risk assessments in preparation for the second half of the Autumn Term. Please help by considering the use of a face mask and social distancing at drop off and collection times, particularly for the first two weeks after half term.

As parents are aware, we have started to have some cases in school, mostly linked at the moment to contacts away from the school. Please continue to take lateral flow tests regularly (twice weekly is advised for the parents of primary aged children) and book at PCR test if there are any symptoms of covid.

We were hoping to welcome volunteers back into school just after half term, but with the current local advice, we cannot do this straight away. We will be reviewing this fortnightly, so if you are able to volunteer in school within your own child's bubble, please contact the school so we have a record of who to contact when this can restart.

Explorers: Our focus this week has been on shapes in maths, looking at triangles and circles in particular. Counting the sides and corners. Inspired by the artist Kandinsky we made some fantastic collages as a class. In phonics we have learnt even more sounds, our outside whiteboard is really useful for practicing on. We created some awesome prints with Emma on Monday using the printing letters and followed this up later in the week using shapes and paint. We had our first fire drill this week and learnt where to go to line up on the playground.

Adventurers: Well it has been quite a week in Adventurers! We must say a massive thank you to Mrs. Hensman for her fantastic work with the class over the past week, the children have really enjoyed having you in. Tis week has seen us finish reading The Danger Gang by Tom Felton with a superb twist right at the end. We have begun to look at writing letters to Dani (Franky's friend in Greyville) about the FEAKY things happening in school. In particular the use of adverbs to help with our descriptive writing. Maths has seen us look at learning a variety of strategies to help us with mental addition. In topic this week the children have planned and taken control of the class for a period of time, to experience what leadership is like and we have visited Shire Hall in Dorchester (well worth a trip if you have the time). The Children have learnt about the journey of one 7 year old boy- Harry as he was tried and convicted in the Victorian court that was once held there. Luckily- Mr Glover managed to get out of the cell just in time to come home!

Navigators: Navigators Thompson and Coleman have had a wonderful week. They have really enjoyed making their Roman slab pots and have done so well to replicate the originals. Week Beginning 27th September 2021

Explorers:In Explorers class this week we have continued to work hard on learning our phonics sounds and how to correctly form the letters. It is fantastic to hear from parents about how their children are noticing and reading the sounds they have been learning in school when they out and about. Our maths focus has been the numbers 1,2 and 3. This may sound simple and many of thee children can count to three without any difficulty. What we have been doing is making sure they can confidently identify these numbers, correctly form the numbers and count amounts out of sequence. We are continuing our topic of people who help us and linked this to the harvest festival celebration. We have also been learning about farmers and how they help us. Thinking about what they grow, how they grow crops and thinking about where our food comes from. As part of our

Harvest celebrations we have also been learning a new song which we look forward to sharing with you all soon. As well as all this we have had plenty of time to enjoy playing and talking to our friends in class. A very important part of their leaning as they develop their communication skills.

Pathfinders: This week in Pathfinders we have been consolidating our knowledge of 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' with lots of retelling and drama games. We have also been looking at the story as writers and learning about adjectives and story structure. We know the story so well now that we even created our own Warning posters with advice for any future bear hunters! In maths we have been exploring different ways of making the same number and how using our number facts to ten can help us solve number problems quicker. In topic we have used google earth to explore the roads local to school and also some of our addresses! We look forward to getting out and about in the local area in the coming weeks. Lastly, we've had a fantastic time creating our Harvest art work in the style of Arcimboldo which we look forward to sharing with you in more detail in the Harvest assembly.

Adventurers: Another amazing week has passed in Adventurers Class. Our thanks goes to Mrs Hensman for the fantastic job he is doing on Mondays and Tuesday with the class. This week we have had a focus on our Harvest Festival contribution- look out for a catchy shanty on the way! We have planned, written and edited our own set of instructions for one of Mum's inventions from her Home Science Lab in the Danger Gang. I have been impressed with the quality of the work the children have produced. In Maths we continue to look at number and place value, with year 3 looking at scales for weight and capacity. Year 4 have been ensuring a good working knowledge of their times tables to help themplease keep supporting your child with Times Tables Rockstars Practice at home. In Topic we have been looking at how different countries are organized and soon will be looking at what it feels like to be in charge. Football has been going from strength to strength on Monday's and in Gymnastics on Friday's the children are creating some exhilarating balance sequences.

Just a note that Mr Glover will be taking the rest of his paternity leave next week, so will not be in school until Tuesday 12th October. He will as ever pick up his emails over the course of this, however there may be a slight delay in getting back to you.

Navigators: In Navigators Class this week we have been busy delving deeper into our class novel 'Escape from Rome' where we have looked at different techniques the author has used to keep the reader's interest. In Maths in Year Six, we've been using and applying different mental strategies, thinking about if a written method would be most efficient and multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 100 in Year Five. We are getting quite quick. Watch out at home! As we have been studying the expansion of the Roman invasion in our topic and now know why the Romans were so good at expanding their territory. Finally, we have been preparing for Harvest with an active poem and though provoking song. The children have worked so hard at their presenting and singing skills.

to blend them to read simple words e.g dad, sat. The children have also been practicing their letter formation. Our maths focus has been repeated pattern. The children have been learning how to follow simple repeating patterns as well as making their own repeating patterns. We have also begun a new topic in class, Help is at hand. This week we have been thinking about all the people who help us. This can range from a Doctor in a hospital to family and friends. We have also made the most of this weeks fantastic weather to do as much learning as possible outdoors while having lots of fun at the same time.

Pathfinders:In Pathfinders this week we have loved starting our new text: We're Going on a Bear Hunt. We have been learning the story through drama and creating our own story maps. We even had some suspicious paw prints in our outside area!! Please ask the children as they should be able to retell the story - almost word for word. They have been great storytellers! In Maths we have enjoyed investigating equivalence using the pan balances to find different ways of making the same number. Explorers: It has been a very busy week in Explorers Class. In phonics we have been learning the new sounds d and t and continuing to consolidate the sounds from last week. In math we have learning about how we can sort items either into matching pairs or by size. We have been focusing on the following mathematical language. Tall, short, longer, smaller, big, bigger and biggest. The children have also enjoyed playing with some new equipment in our outdoor area. The most popular being the steering wheel stand. The children have been using this to go on some fantastical journeys around the world. I have been transported by bus, ship, car, truck and even a tractor on these exciting trips. The children have made maps of where they are going and written out their own tickets. Looking forward to some new and interesting journeys next week.

Pathfinders: In Pathfinders this week we have been completing acrostic poems all about ourselves. We even made a class poem about being a Pathfinder! In Maths we have been securing our understanding of numbers to 20, both their order and their value. We have worked on increasing our maths fluency with number recognition and our doubles. Finally,

we have enjoyed lots of teamwork games and activities to help our communication skills as a class.

Adventurers: What a week we have had in Adventurers Class. We have enjoyed PE in the sunshine and are developing our fantastic balance work in Gymnastics. In Maths we have continued to explore Place Value and how this impacts on our number system, whilst in English we have been learning about Imperative Verbs- I hope they don't become too bossy at home! Our Topic work around being the Very Best Version of Ourselves has seen us create a recipe for a good friend with some excellent examples. Mr Glover will be away on Monday and Tuesday this week as starts his Paternity Leave but please do not hesitate to email him. He will pick them up and reply as soon as he can. Mrs Hensman will be covering him for the next few weeks and they have already ensured a smooth transition for the class.

Navigators: We have had a great week this week with our 'Very best version of me' topic. In English, we have studied poetic devices and written our own poems about bullying. In topic, we have been splitting off into year groups: the Year Sixes learning about puberty and the Year Fives about relationships and how to cope with worries. All very important life skills and knowledge. We have also had the wonderful opportunity to create our own prints with local artist Emma who is doing some work on the Char Valley and of course, Year Six have begun their swimming sessions for this term. Welcome Back

The children have quickly settled into their routines and it has been a real delight to have them back in school with stories about the summer and excitement about our upcoming learning.

The children have really worked hard this week and we can see how tired they are! We have updated our expectations for home learning document and will be sharing it next week — the children need a break this weekend! We have been really pleased with how well so many children have got back on track in their learning after such disruption to school life over the last two years and we want to ensure that every child is achieving in line with their potential; your support at home is a key aspect to ensuring this. We know from our pupils surveys that the majority of our children feel happy and safe at school, but we know that there are times when a child may not feel as happy and safe as they should. Please do speak to or update your child's class teacher so we can work together to ensure your child is able to thrive at school.



Explorers: We have had a fantastic first week back in Explorers class. The Explorers have all settled very well into being in school full time and have still been full of energy at the end of the day. They have all enjoyed getting to know each other and are full of enthusiasm for their learning. They have been introduced to three new sounds in phonics (m, a, s) and have begun to learn how to write these letters. We have also had a focus on improving the children's fine motor skills and hand strength, as this is the foundation for their writing skills. A fun first week full of laughing, exploring, playing and learning. We are looking forward to the mini explorers joining us next week.



Pathfinders: All of Pathfinders have settled back into school brilliantly and have been bonding really well with their new class mates. As part of our current topic 'The Very Best Version of me' we have been focusing on understanding and processing our feelings, using the story of 'The Colour Monster' to help us. The children have come up with some lovely suggestions for how to cope with different feelings. From a week on Monday, our next topic will be 'Unity in the Community; where I belong' which will have a strong Geography focus as we explore our local area in more detail. We will also be looking at stories with recurring language, using 'We're Going on a Bear hunt' as our main text. Whilst we will stay together as a class for English, Maths will be taught in year groups with Miss Morrison working with the year twos and Mrs Cornish teaching the year ones. Our PE days will be on Mondays and Fridays so please ensure children come to school in their PE kits on those days. *Miss Morrison*



Adventurers: What a week we have had in Adventurers. It has been so lovely to see all the children settle back into school. We have been writing poems this week, looking at different forms within poetry, such as Haiku. We have started to read the book: The Danger Gang, which we will use over the coming weeks to write instructions. In our topic work; 'The Very Best Version of Me' we have been considering our feelings and emotions and how these can lead and affect our reactions to things. In a week's time we will be looking at our theme 'Law and Order' for seven weeks. *Mr Glover*





Navigators: The children have settled beautifully into their new class and routines already, despite some unexpected staffing. It has been a real pleasure to see them so quickly return to their excellent learning behaviours. This week we have been looking at the book Cloud Busting which is written in different forms of poetry. In maths, both year groups have been focused on place value. During the afternoons there has been a PSHE focus as part of the 'The Very Best Version of Me' unit, giving children the opportunity explore and consider structures, routines and rules as well as friendships and equal rights. PE for children in Navigators classes is on Monday and Wednesday. Children in year 6 will be swimming on Wednesdays this half term and year 5 children will start their swimming after half term. In

addition to the above, we have started our class novel, Escape from Rome, in preparation for our upcoming topic 'You're Not Invited'. *Mrs Cornish and Mrs Hopson*
