#### What tests will my child take?

The Key Stage 1 SATs officially assess your child's Maths and English abilities. Although these are formal tests, they are done in a relaxed way; in fact, most children are not even aware they're taking a test!


There are a number of elements to the KS1 SATS tests, including Maths, Reading and English grammar, punctuation and spelling.

Science and Writing will also be assessed but will be teacher assessed not a formal test.



#### **Key Stage 2 Reading**

A single paper with questions based on three passages. Your child will have one hour, including reading time, to complete the test.





#### Key Stage 2 spelling, punctuation and grammar test

There are two papers for this test:

- 1) Grammar and punctuation paper requires short answers, lasting 45 minutes,
- 2) Aural spelling test of 20 words, lasting around 15 minutes





#### **Key Stage 2 maths**


Children sit three papers in maths:

Paper 1: arithmetic, 30 minutes (40 questions)

Paper 2: reasoning 40 minutes


Paper 3: reasoning

#### How will Key Stage 2 SATs be marked?

After each test, the papers are sealed in an envelope ready to be collected for external marking.

In your child's end-of-year report, you will be given their raw score (the actual number of marks they get), alongside their scaled score and whether they have reached the expected standard set by the Department for Education ('NS' means that the expected standard was not achieved and 'AS' means the expected standard was achieved).


The range of scaled scores available for each KS2 test is: 80 (the lowest scaled score that can be awarded) 120 (the highest scaled score)


The expected standard for each test is a scaled score of 100-120.

Greater depth is considered to be a score of 110-120.



How you can support you child









The best thing you can do is to encourage your child to complete their homework on time and to the very best of their ability. Talk to them about their learning in class and praise them for their achievements.

SATs are very similar to our usual assessments and will be a part of normal school life. We do not wish any extra pressure to be put on the children and mention them 'matter of factly' in class.

However if you would like your child to complete extra studies at home in preparation for their SATs, companies like Collins and CGP have a wide range of books to support this.

In school we use the 2016 - 2020 past SATs papers alongside the CGP test papers which are written in the same style.


#### Please don't use these at home!

#### **Key Stage 2 Science**

Science is teacher assessed. There is no externally set test.

#### **Key Stage 2 Writing**

The children do not sit a writing test.

Children's writing is based on teacher assessment across a range of writing in different styles. This is often open to the judgement of external moderators who will visit the school to verify the results by reading the children's writing and engaging in discussions with the class teacher.
